The Fiske Genealogical Library is located on the lower level of the Washington Pioneer Hall at 1644 43rd Avenue East in Seattle, just south of Madison Park on the shore of Lake Washington. Please use the stairway on the North side of the building.

The library is housed in the basement of the Pioneer down a stairway, and isn't handicap accessible. Upstairs in the Pioneer hall, it is accessible. However, the library isn't upstairs.

### **Buses and Parking**

The 11 Madison Park Metro bus from Downtown Seattle comes directly to our door. You can catch the #11 bus on Pike street in front of the <u>Washington State Convention Center</u>.

Free all-day parking is available in the angle-in parking spaces in the block next to Madison Park Beach. further down the street, 4-hour parking spots serve the playfield and beach. Street parking in the neighborhoods and business district is available. Street handicapped parking is here: (map)

The Fiske Genealogical Foundation is a non-profit (503(c)3) educational institution. Successor to the Fiske Genealogical Center, founded in 1971 by Arthur D. Fiske, a professional genealogist. The Foundation has two major goals:

- to provide on-going education in genealogical research techniques.
- to build a library of genealogical materials not readily available, especially for those townships east
  of the Mississippi River.

The Fiske Genealogical Foundation is administered by a board of trustees and is incorporated under the laws of the State of Washington.

#### **About Arthur Fiske**

Arthur Fiske became interested in his family history while very young man. He joined the Seattle Genealogical society in 1952 and immediately began to assist both that organization and the Seattle Public Library in acquiring their genealogical collections. Arthur soon became well known as a research expert. After he began teaching in 1969 he built up a library of his own, The Fiske Library. In 1971 he founded the

Fiske Genealogical Foundation and gave his library to the foundation. Arthur Fiske died June 14, 1996.

### **Using the Fiske Library**

The library has lots to offer. Here are a few things to know when you walk through the door....

#### **How the Collection is Arranged**

The volumes have been rearranged to Library of Congress numbering. Click here for a diagram of the shelving. There are blue notebooks in with the books by town and by surname... these are notes from library patrons containing their own work and photocopies of books we don't have on our shelves. These can be very useful.

### The Fiske Card Catalogue

On the back wall there is a card catalogue, which was created by Arthur Fiske from his work. Each card has a surname. Most of this material is now available on line, but sometimes there are cards with reference you may find useful. It's a good place to start with searching for names.

### **Library Equipment**

There is free wifi in the library. You can print wirelessly on the Sharp copier. Library patrons can access WorldCat and Ancestry.com through two computers. There is a microfilm reader.

### The Sharp Copier Can do Wonderful Things!

The Sharp copier can make black and white photocopies of documents for 15 cents per 8.5x11 sheet, or .25 per 11x17 sheet. It can also scan pages which you can email from the copier for no charge. If you print from your computer using wifi, you may need to add the printer driver the first time. Download this from the Sharp website LINK and install it. Choose printer.

### **Getting Research Help**

Research help is available by email or phone call. Lookups can be done at no cost by a volunteer if you know the volume and page. Scans can be emailed for no charge. It is free, and for more in-depth help professional genealogists can be hired.

Online research tools include the library's Ancestry.com account (for use at the library's computers), and a link to WorldCat's worldwide library catalogue. The extensive "Finding Helps" pages detail resources for states and countries.

#### **Fees**

User fees are \$5 a day or \$40 a year

Copier is .15 a page, scans to email are free.

Most Wednesday classes are \$5 each or \$40 for the series.

You can check out volumes for \$1 a week each, and they are available on interlibrary loan for a fee based on postage and weight of the book.

Checks and cash are accepted forms of payment.

### **Getting Started: Researching your Family Tree**

With some instruction in the basics, a class or two, and perhaps the help of a professional genealogist when you get stuck, you can make considerable progress researching your own family history. Here are some tips for documenting your research, from the basic family tree to in-depth citations. There are many ways to do this but here are some ideas that have worked for some of us.

### **Organizing Your Research**

#### **Numbering System:**

Assign a number to each ancestor. Most genealogy programs will do this automatically.

You are 1.
Your dad is 2,
your mom is 3.
Every male's number is double his son's.
His wife is his number plus one.
